

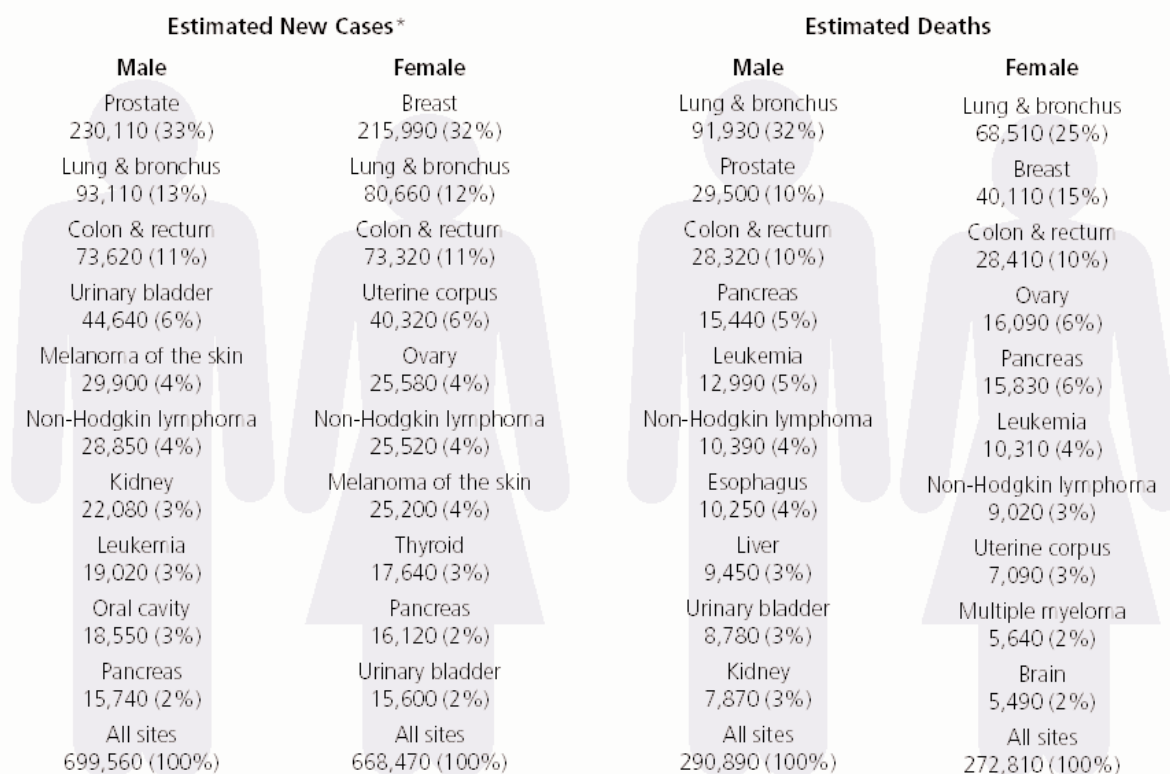
Breast Cancer: Basic Facts

Incidence – The American Cancer society estimates that 215,990 of the 668,470 (32%) new cases of cancer will be due to breast cancer estimated for 2004 (highest rate of any cancer amongst women).

Mortality – The American Cancer Society estimates that 40,110 of the 272,810 (25%) female cancer deaths will be caused by breast cancer in 2004 (2nd highest rate for any cancer amongst women).

For a woman who is free of cancer at the following age intervals, her risk of developing breast cancer over the next ten years is:

| Age | 10 year Risk |
|-----|--------------|
| 20 | 1 in 2,152 |
| 30 | 1 in 251 |
| 40 | 1 in 69 |
| 50 | 1 in 36 |
| 60 | 1 in 26 |
| 70 | 1 in 23 |
